The Right to Dream

The Idaho Falls Arts Council is pleased to present the Living Voices production of *The Right to Dream* in the Carr Gallery on May 17th at 7:30pm.

The Right to Dream follows an African American student in Mississippi during the Civil Rights Movement. Though from a respected family with close white friends, the impact of racism is felt at a young age. Our student encounters and learns from leaders of the movement like Rosa Parks and Martin Luther King Jr. and joins the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee.

Living Voices is a theater company based out of Seattle that specializes in single actor, multimedia productions. All Living Voices productions focus on a historic movement and a composite character created based on primary resources. *The Right to Dream* is designed to be told from a male or female perspective.

"We love the thoughtful discussions that Living Voices' presentations facilitate," said Brandi Newton, Executive Director of the Idaho Falls Arts Council, "When we take these shows into schools, we watch kids engage with history in a new way."

The Right to Dream is recommended for ages 11 and up due to some graphic material.
